



## **MADDY ACT POSTING**

### **BOARD, COMMISSION, COMMITTEE AND FOUNDATION SEATS**

#### **Revised to Reflect Recent Appointments and Vacancy**

Pursuant to Government Code §54970, also known as the Maddy Act, on or before December 31 of each year, each legislative body shall prepare an appointments list of all regular and ongoing boards, commissions, and committees, which are appointed by the legislative body of the local agency.

**At a City Council meeting held on February 5, 2008 the Fountain Valley City Council made appointments to those positions with vacancies or scheduled expired terms as of January 2008. The positions listed below (printed in red) are those appointments that will expire in January 2009 or are currently vacant.**

Appointments will be for two-year terms except in the case of alternates, who will be appointed to one-year terms. All candidates for appointments must be residents of Fountain Valley and 18 years of age or older.

More specifically, to solicit, receive, invest and make grants of funds, property and other resources and to provide direct charitable services to aid, sponsor, promote, advance and assist worthy activities, programs and services in the City of Fountain Valley; and to establish and maintain a permanent collection of named funds that carry out the diverse charitable purposes specified by the governing body and donors.

The initial Board will play a crucial role in establishing the Community Foundation and setting its goals. Therefore, the person applying for this position should hold the following minimum qualifications:

- 1) Live or work within the City of Fountain Valley
- 2) Experience working with nonprofit organizations

The Fountain Valley Community Foundation Board's initial functions and responsibilities will be to adopt governing bylaws, develop a budget and setup accounts, file with both Federal and State agencies, apply for nonprofit status, establish goals, manage assets, develop marketing publication to attract financial support, and assist worthy activities, programs and services in the City of Fountain Valley. The Board will meet on an as needed basis which will be determined by the Board of Directors at the first meeting.
