



General Plan Advisory Committee (GPAC) Request for Volunteer Quadrant 2 Vacancy

Overview

The City invites individuals interested in participating as an at-large member of the GPAC representing Quadrant 2 to submit a Statement of Interest for City Council consideration. Quadrant 2 is identified in the map below as the area north of Slater Avenue and east of Brookhurst Street. If you are interested in participating and would like to serve as a GPAC member, please complete the application form and submit it to the City by July 14, 2022. The City Council will review the applications submitted and select one resident to represent Quadrant 2.

Responsibilities

The City of Fountain Valley assembled the General Plan Advisory Committee (GPAC) in 2018 to advise the City on the topics and issues addressed in the General Plan. Included in the General Plan are discussions related to: land use, mobility, open space, conservation, public safety, noise, housing, community design, economic development, environmental justice, and community health and wellness. The GPAC serves as an important channel for the community to provide input and make recommendations regarding these important topics.

The GPAC consists of approximately 15 community members that represent a diversity of interests. The GPAC meets as needed on weekdays at 6pm with each meeting generally lasting 2-3 hours. **As the General Plan Update process is nearing completion, the GPAC is expected to meet up to three additional times in 2022.** City staff will bring the new GPAC member up to speed in advance of their first meeting, providing them with an overview of the update process and activities conducted to date.

- The GPAC is subject to the Brown Act, California's Open Meeting Law, and will hold regular, noticed and agendized public meetings.
- Prior to each meeting, members are expected to review required reading material (50-100 pages) and be ready to discuss key issues and opportunities with the group.
- Participation by members appointed to the GPAC is temporary; the roles and responsibilities of its members will terminate with City Council adoption of the General Plan.
